


Smart Wi-Fi Plug User Manual

Input Voltage: AC 110V - 240V
Output: 16A Maximum Load
Wireless Type: 2.4GHz, 1T1R
App Support: iOS /Android



Simplified steps to install app on your smart device and pair with Amazon Alexa, Google Assistant and IFTTT using Smart Life App on Apple Store/Google Play Store. Compatible with any smart phone or tablet including both Android and iOS systems.

How to connect Smart Plug to Wi-Fi network

1. Download **Smart Life** from or .

Download or scan the QR code and install the Smart Life App for either iOS or Android. Once downloaded, the app will ask to register your device. Enter your mobile number or email address. Select the country you reside in. If a mobile number was provided, you will receive an SMS with a registration number. If an email address was provided, you will need to create a password.



Note: There's no Registration Code needed if email method was chosen

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Note: There are two configuration modes (Quick Mode/AP Mode) available for you to choose before adding the device on the app. Quick Mode is recommended.

Quick Mode Configuration (Recommended)

1. Make sure Quick Mode configuration is initiated: The indicator light will blink slowly. Press and hold the power button on the Smart plug for 6 seconds until the indicator light blinks rapidly.
2. On the app, Click on the "+" icon in the top right corner. Enter your device type in the "Add Device" tab.





3. Follow the in-app instructions to connect the Smart Plug to your Wi-Fi network.





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
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
How to connect Smart Plug to Amazon Alexa

1. Launch Smart Life App, sign into your account and make sure Smart Plug is in the device list.
2. Modify the device name so that Alexa can easily recognize it, eg.: Living room light, Bedroom light, etc.
3. Minimize Smart Life App, then launch the Alexa App and sign into your Alexa account. Make sure you have at least one Alexa voice-controlled device installed, eg.: Echo, Echo dot, etc.
4. Click the button in the top left corner to show App menu. Then click **Skills** in the menu.



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
5. Search "Smart Life" in the search panel.



6. Enable Smart Life, then sign in your Smart Life account to complete the account linking.



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


7. After account linking was successful, ask Alexa to discover devices. After 20-second device discovery, Alexa will show all the discovered devices.



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8. Go back to Menu by clicking button, and then click **Smart Home** button.



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
9. In "Smart Home" page, you can group your devices for different categories. Your Smart Life App is now compatible with Alexa. Now you can control your Smart Plug through Alexa.



How to connect Smart Plug to Google Home


1. Launch the Google Home App and make sure Google Home speaker is installed. If not, follow Google Home speaker installation instruction to complete the installation.

2. Once Google Home is installed, click the button in the top left corner of the App Home Page, the App menu will then show. Then Click "Home Control" in the Menu.



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
3. On the "Add devices" page, scroll down and click on "Smart Life". Sign into your Smart Life App account and password. Choose Smart Life App in the drop-down menu to complete the account linking.



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4. After the account linking was successful, you can see all the smart devices from your Smart Life App account in the Google Home App. You can assign rooms for each device.

5. Now you can use Google Home to control your smart devices. You can for example say the following:
Ok Google, turn on/off wall light.
Ok Google, set bedroom light to red.



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Troubleshooting and FAQ

1. **What devices can I control with the Smart Plug?**
You can control lights, fans, portable heaters, and any small appliances in accordance with the Smart Plug's specifications.
2. **What should I do when I cannot turn the Smart Plug on or off?**
 - Make sure your mobile devices and the Smart Plug are connected to the same Wi-Fi network.
 - Make sure the devices that connected to the Smart Plug are turned on.
3. **What should I do when device configuration process has failed**
 - Check whether the Smart Plug is turned on.
 - Check whether your mobile device is connected to 2.4GHz Wi-Fi network.
 - Check your network connectivity. Make sure the router is working properly.
 - If you have a dual-band router, select 2.4GHz network and then add Smart Plug.
 - Enable the router's broadcasting function.
 - Configure the encryption method as WPA2-PSK and authorization type as AES, or set both as auto.
 - Wireless mode can't be 11n only

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- Check for Wi-Fi interference or relocate the Smart Plug to another location within the signal range.
 - Check whether the router's connected devices reach the amount limit. Please try to turn off some devices' Wi-Fi function and configure Smart Plug again.
 - Check if router's wireless MAC filtering function is enabled. Remove the device from filter list and make sure the router is not prohibiting Smart Plug from connection.
 - Make sure the password of your Wi-Fi network entered in app is correct when adding the Smart Plug.
 - Make sure the Smart Plug is ready for App-Config mode: The blue indicator light will blink rapidly in Quick Mode Configuration. The blue indicator light will blink slowly in AP Mode Configuration.
 - Repeat the App-Config process.
 - Factory reset the Smart Plug and try to add it again.
4. **Can I control a device through 2G/3G/4G cellular network?**
The Smart Plug and the mobile device are required to be connected to the same Wi-Fi network when adding the Smart Plug for the first time. After device configuration is successful, you can remotely control the device through 2G/3G/4G cellular network.

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1. **How can I share my device with family?**
Open app, go to "Profile" > "Device Sharing" > "Sent", tap Add Sharing, now you can share the device with added family members.
 6. **How do I reset this device?**
Factory reset: After Smart Plug is plugged onto power socket, press and hold (for 6 seconds) the power button for factory reset until the indicator light blinks blue rapidly
- Indicator Lighting Pattern:**
- Rapid blinking blue: Quick Mode Configurations is initiated.
 - Slow blinking blue: AP Mode Configuration is initiated.
 - Solid blue: The Smart Plug is connected to Wi-Fi network.
 - Solid red: Power socket of the Smart Plug is switched on. The indicator light could turn to solid red from any other status (Rapid/Slow blinking, Solid blue or off) by pressing the power button once. When pressing the power button again, the status will return back to solid red light.
 - Off: The Smart Plug is switched off or not connected to a Wi-Fi network.

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
